## Clinical Psychology (1963-1976)/Adult Clinical Psychology (1976-2004)/Clinical Psychology (2004-present)

After moving into Oglebay Hall, the Department of Psychology launched its new doctoral program organized around two areas of faculty expertise: (a) Teaching of General Psychology, and (b) Clinical Psychology. A third area of emphasis was added in 1966: Life Span Developmental Psychology. This Table includes the 5 faculty lines comprising the Clinical Psychology area. Some additional faculty were added, as joint positions were created with other programs and/or departments that required clinical psychology expertise (e.g., Department of Behavioral Medicine and Psychiatry; Student Counseling Center). The departmental re-organization of its graduate program areas in 1976 resulted in separate program areas for Adult Clinical and Child Clinical Psychology. For purposes of these data, faculty who comprised the Child Clinical Psychology faculty are not depicted here.
