

Systems Psychology (1976-1992)

The Systems Psychology area of emphasis was created during the departmental re-organization in 1976 because several faculty across the various program areas had expertise in this area. Faculty retained their "home" program area, but also served on the Systems faculty. The program actively recruited students for four years, but the area was difficult to sustain when faculty with interests in this area left WVU. During the 1980s, a systems concentration was still offered to students admitted to one of the other graduate training areas, but in 1992, the Systems program was discontinued.
