

Teaching of General Psychology (1963-1969)/Experimental Psychology (1969-1976)/Behavior Analysis (1976-present)

After moving into Oglebay Hall, the Department of Psychology launched its new doctoral program organized around two areas of faculty expertise:
(a) Teaching of General Psychology, and (b) Clinical Service Psychology. A third area of emphasis was added in 1966: Life Span Developmental Psychology.
This Table includes the 6 faculty lines comprising the Teaching of General Psychology area that evolved into an emphasis in Experimental Psychology in 1969.
The departmental re-organization of its graduate program areas in 1976 resulted in shifting the focus of the Experimental Psychology program to Behavior Analysis.
